As I am sure you are aware RTO has switched health care providers and we are now with Global Excel Management Inc. It is always best if we never find out how efficient this new team performs, however the time may come when you need to use their services as I did during a recent pre-pandemic vacation in Florida. I had mysteriously contracted a serious bacterial infection in my arm which resulted in one visit to urgent care and one to a hospital. I called the 877 number and was quickly connected to an agent. After a few questions to confirm my identity I relayed my symptoms and need to see a doctor. I was given a file number and told to proceed to the urgent care. Very easy. However, upon arrival I was told they did not accept any international health coverage so had to pay out of pocket. Global Excel quickly emailed me claim forms to recover my payment, which I hoped would go as smoothly.

Two days later my infection seemed to worsen so I called Global Excel again and referred to the same file number and was directed to go to the hospital without delay. This time the hospital accepted my insurance and I was seen quickly. All in all it seemed to be a positive experience with Global Excel. Ten days later my arm was almost back to normal.

During the past few months our District 20 Executive has met through Zoom and the help of our Provincial technical support team. Business is not "as usual", but we are all making the best of our conditions. There are no travel plans for now and no face-to-face meetings or luncheons or breakfasts. In the future you will be informed of news and potential gatherings. Our grant programs are still open for applications for your educationally connected volunteer activities. From the RTOERO Foundation Blog Posts from June 2020:

As the Ontario government updates its poverty reduction strategy, RTOERO urges the government to consider how its policies and programs will improve the quality of life for seniors.

The seniors' population will grow to over 3 million by 2023. As the government notes, the poverty rate for seniors is 12.1%. Seniors are among the six groups the province identifies as being at heightened risk of poverty, along with Indigenous people, single mothers, people with disabilities, recent immigrants, and racialized communities.

The RTOERO Foundation, which invests funds in efforts that benefits Canada's seniors, calls social isolation a barrier to healthy aging. Social isolation can lead to missed economic opportunities and poverty. Meanwhile, poverty means that seniors can't always access the resources that decrease isolation. Finding more ways to connect seniors – to family, friends and neighbours, to colleagues in volunteer roles and workplaces, and to our communities – is vital to their well-being in every way.


## Wear a face covering
