PAC COMMITTEE REPORT PROVINCIAL ELECTION, June 2, 2022

In 2012, the federal government in a boundaries redistribution exercise, created the new riding of **Hastings-Lennox & Addington**. This new riding fell within the boundaries of RTOERO District 19-Hastings Prince Edward and RTOERO District 20-Frontenac Lennox & Addington. Beginning with the first election following that decision, these two Districts have worked collaboratively with other education unions to sponsor All Candidates' Meetings.

On December 9, 2021, RTOERO District 19 and RTOERO District 20 restarted this collaborative approach to provide a program during the 2022 Ontario Provincial Election. The two Districts forwarded a proposal to the Teacher and CUPE unions within the following school boards to enter into an agreement to work together on a program during the election:

Change to the Process of Submitting Insurance Claims

Currently, members can submit claims until the end of the **next** calendar year after the date the expense was incurred. For example, 2021 receipts can be submitted until December 2022. Most members submit claims almost immediately and this

change will not affect them.

However, as of January 2023, claims **must** be submitted within **six months** of the date of the expense. For example, if you have a dental appointment on May 1, 2023, you have until October 31, 2023 to submit the claim.

Addition to Travel Insurance Coverage

As of May 1, 2022, members will be covered if they need to cancel, interrupt or delay a trip because they or their travelling companion have a positive COVID 19 test result. This will also include additional expenses if they need to quarantine at their destination or are refused boarding due to a positive COVID 19 test.
