Political Advocacy Report (PAC) David Kendall Committee Chair and Councillor

TIME MOVES ON AND **CHANGE IS INEVITABLE**

In 1968 the five teacher affiliates in Ontario established a new organization,

The Superannuated Teachers of Ontario (STO), which was designed to defend and make pensions more normalized. By 1986 STO entered into a relationship with Johnson Inc. to administer its

group health benefits plan which has carried on until the present.

In 1998 the Superannuation . Commission of Ontario renamed itself as the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan (OTPP) followed by STO renaming

itself as the Retired Teachers of Ontario (RTOERO). During this same time period Intact Insurance By 2002 RTOERO opened its doors to include associate members in its portfolio which over time expanded to include surviving spouses and, more recently, active membership.

The year 2018 was a significant one as RTOERO undertook to change from being organized under Ontario legislation to being structured under the Canada Not-For-Profit Corporations Act (CNCA). At that time it made sense to identify as a "national" organization as we already had members in every province and territory in the country with 2 of our 48 Districts located in British Columbia. Three years later RTOERO created three new official Districts: The Prairies (Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba), Atlantic and Quebec.

We also undertook to explore a name change to reflect that we offered membership to anyone working in the education system including colleges and universities. After much deliberation, the proposed new name "Vive" was resoundingly turned down by the Corporate Members.

During 2022 and 2023 RTOERO explored changing the name of our group health insurance plan as we were considering expanding our coverage to include those in education in other provinces and

> territories. Other areas were interested in our plan but resisted that it was named RTOERO and from Ontario. The new name "Entente" was widely endorsed and we now have the Entente group health insurance plan.

purchased Johnson Inc. More recently, another subsidiary of Intact, Bellaire Select, has assumed responsibility for administering Johnson's home and auto policies to which many of our members belong. We have been advised that in 2025 Bellaire Select will also take over the administration of our Entente group health insurance plan.

Last year RTOERO once again began reviewing its name and will propose a new name to its Corporate Members at the May 2024 Annual Meeting. It is believed that a more inclusive name will remind applicants that RTOERO supports all employees in the education sector.



SALT: DISTRICT 20's NEW PARTNERSHIP

Every year District 20 provides support to community groups in terms of grants. Many of these organizations

tend to be in the more developed areas of our District - Kingston and Napanee. During this past year District 20 established a relationship with the **SALT** group - **Seniors and Law Enforcement Together** - which is centred in Sharbot Lake and has serviced seniors in Central and North Frontenac since 2019. The law enforcement partner with SALT works out of the Hartington OPP detachment.

The SALT motto identifies its purpose as Building Trust, Safety and Awareness. Its Mission is "To respect, educate and communicate with seniors in Central and North Frontenac Townships in partnership with the Frontenac OPP.'

The SALT team will act as a communication link between seniors and service providers and increase awareness of services for seniors. Through its workshop program SALT pursues the following objectives:

- -Increase awareness of services available for seniors
- -Improve communication networks between seniors, local service agencies and the Frontenac OPP
- -Develop and implement local information services to

seniors including:

- -Crime prevention and safety ie. fraud and scams
- -Writing wills and power of attorney
- -Financial information
- -Fire Prevention
- -Care and support for dementia and Alzheimer's
- -Care and compassion

Last year District 20 provided financial assistance to this group when their financial support was diminishing for their programming. Now the District is working with SALT representatives to prepare an application to RTOERO for a Community Grant which will again support programming in 2024-25.

District 20 members are encouraged to attend the informative SALT programs. Watch for emails from Communication Councillor, Patricia Bland, when programs are planned in the northern territory of our District. Dementia

🚺 Dementia is a chronic condition that grows more severe over time. Each person experiences dementia in a different way and it is a worry to us all. Dementia can be characterized as a decline in memory and cognitive function and an impaired use of language, judgement, and planning. Dementia can cause changes in mood and behaviour with a lack of interest to complete tasks. Some physical changes may include loss of co-ordination, weak and stiff muscles, trouble sitting and

standing, and loss of bladder control.

There is no cure for dementia to date. However, there are some treatments that may help to ease the symptoms and improve the quality of life.

What can we do?

There are risk factors that are associated with dementia. They include:

-lack of sleep -smoking

- diabetes and blood sugar levels -inactivity (physical)

-sleep apnea (or a lack of oxygen to the brain)

-lack of cognitive stimulus -family history (only 1 %)

-ApoE Status (which is a gene that a doctor can test.)

It is crucial to think of our brain as an organ. For our brain to function optimally, it requires oxygen, energy, fuel (from our diet) and fluid (from our blood). Therefore, it may be necessary to make changes to our lifestyle to ensure our brain continues to function affectively. Even small changes can help! For more info go to www.canada.ca/dementia.

Surviving Spouse Benefits

There are few life situations as challenging as the death of a spouse or, for dependent children, the death of their parents/caregivers. If the primary member of the RTOERO Entente Group Insurance Plan dies, surviving spouses or dependent(s) can become members and enjoy the same benefits. What to expect:

Johnson Insurance needs to receive the death certificate. Call 416-920-7248 or 1-877-406-9007, or use email at healthbenefits@johnson.ca.

Johnson Insurance sends the surviving spouse or dependent a continuation of benefits form and postage-paid envelope. The form needs to be completed and sent back.

The surviving spouse or dependent will then become an RTOERO member if they aren't already. They will be enrolled in the Entente benefits.

All historical file notes and claims history will transfer to the surviving spouse's record. They'll receive a new benefits package, card, and a welcome package from RTOERO.

Tips to Avoid Romance Scams

The idea of being scammed through an online romance is

heartbreaking - you think you're building a relationship with someone, only to find out it was all part of a plan. You may be scammed into covering travel costs to meet in person, or they might tell you about a family emergency and that they need financial help to deal with it.

This type of scam is sadly common it cost Canadians more than \$50.3 million in losses in 2023, according to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre.


